### **Call for Proposals:**

Faculty Research Sprints, hosted by the *[university or college name]* Libraries, offer faculty the opportunity to partner with a team of expert librarians on a specific project, or component of a broader project. Sprints differ from one-time consultations in their timing and depth of interaction. The intent is for the entire team—faculty and librarians—to work without distractions to produce a tangible product or outcome.

Potential project areas include, but are not limited to:

- Archival research
- Data and metadata creation, management, analysis, and preservation
- Digital scholarship project development (GIS mapping, data visualization, etc.)
- Grant proposals
- Open educational resource creation (open textbooks, teaching videos, etc.)
- Pedagogy and instructional design (course assignment redesign, learning objects, etc.)
- Publication proposal or journal creation
- Literature and scoping reviews or annotated bibliographies

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### **Eligibility:**

Eligibility is limited to tenured, tenure-track, or clinical faculty members at the *[university or college name]*. The expectation is that the faculty members will be present for the entire duration of the Sprints, although they are welcome to invite graduate students to participate on teams.

Proposals should be for a project that can be completed in the one-week timeframe. We will work to match faculty members with the appropriate areas of expertise from across Libraries in alignment with the needs of the project. Acceptance will be determined by the justification for and feasibility of the project, as well as the availability of Libraries resources and staff to contribute to the project.
